

Request For Proposals 2021 Youth Grant Pitch Contest

Summary

The SCI Youth Grant Pitch Contest is designed to engage youth-led groups based in Wilmington, Winchester, and Woburn in community projects designed to address the mental health needs of their peers. Youth groups invited to participate will be paired with a professional coach. These coaches will assist adult advisors in mentoring each youth group throughout the development of project ideas & proposals. The program will culminate in a Pitch Contest event, where a panel of judges will award Grant funds for project implementation to selected groups.

Information

A core value of SCI is engaging youth in developing and implementing solutions to the problems they face in their communities. The goal of the Youth Grant Pitch Contest is to provide young people with the opportunity to:

- 1. Decide how to strengthen their community
- 2. Learn public speaking, project management & collaborative skills
- 3. Network & build new relationships

This program aims to put young people in the driver's seat of positive change, while providing them with the guidance, monetary resources, and social capital they need to make a real impact.

SCI is particularly concerned about the mental health needs of minoritized demographics of young people: particularly BIPOC, English Language Learners, LGBTQ+, and low-income students. These youth face additional mental health challenges that have only been exacerbated by the pandemic, as their families bear a disproportionate share of the economic and health impacts of COVID-19. SCI encourages youth group applicants to create projects that will impact minoritized students.
