



SCI AmeriCorps – Youth Leadership Coordinator

The SCI AmeriCorps program supports youth success by connecting young people with the relationships, experiences, and resources they need to succeed. Members implement volunteer outreach and capacity building activities that increase volunteer participation, and provide leadership training and service-learning opportunities for youth. Since 2007, SCI AmeriCorps members have served at various host sites in Greater Boston, who are aligned with the mission of Social Capital Inc.

SCI AmeriCorps is currently looking for members to fill Youth Leadership Coordinator positions for a 1700-hour service commitment between September 2020 and June 2021. The YLC will increase the capacity of host sites to implement social capital building, youth engagement and community service-learning as strategies to achieve high educational outcomes.

The SCI AmeriCorps member will:

- Spearhead a middle school college and career ‘Advisory’ program as well as facilitate training, activities, and projects for a group of high school volunteers from the Margarita Muñiz Academy.
- Lead ‘Advisory’ program participants in engaging peer youth in community service learning through the peer-mentoring after school homework program and in other civic activities by attending and helping to promote community and partner events and programs.
- Be responsible for researching best practices for the ‘Advisory’ program, and tracking students’ progress through a series of both qualitative and quantitative evaluations.
- Boost the sustainability of middle school advisory and volunteer training programs through the creation of a legacy document. This document will serve as a how-to guide on creating relevant curricula, recruiting students into programs, and improving programming for the future.

- Able to commit to Full-Time service in local communities with diverse residents
- Effective communication skills to conduct community outreach through marketing strategies and civic engagement
- Strong work ethic, collaboration, and time management skills
- *Availability to serve predominantly in-person*
