Program Highlights

Celebrating the diversity of our communities

Over 400 people joined our second annual Juneteenth celebration. SCI, along with many community partners, organized an event that offered inspiration, joy, important history, displays of local talent, and more.

Advancing equitable service experiences with SCI AmeriCorps

We are taking strides toward creating a more equitable service experience by increasing SCI AmeriCorps member stipends and expanding our member training program. These changes will improve the member experience, and open the door for more of our community members to serve.

Providing opportunities & resources for youth-led projects

Youth participants in a paid internship program created an accessible and lasting resource for their peers - a website, Middlesex4MentalHealth.org, offering knowledge, activities, and more for youth to learn, and improve their own mental health. This was a youth-led project with guidance and resources from SCI and partner organization, Network for Social Justice.

Equipping local leaders with resources and knowledge

With the SCI Vaccine Equity Program (VEAP), over 150 trusted community members trained as ambassadors to share factual vaccine information and guidance to their networks, have reached thousands and counting.

Promoting a culture of ongoing learning and Allyship

A free resource to guide people in understanding meaningful and active allyship is now available on the SCI website. SCI staff has also brought this training to different groups, including a virtual program.
